If you continue to drive your car up till the first snow or ice storm of the season, then you most likely will be driving when it is dark out. Lighting on your vehicle is very important for you to see down the road and be seen by others. This story started last year during our trip to Lake George. Glen Brayman was behind me in his 41 Ford when I noticed how bright his headlights were. When I asked him what type of lights they were and where he got them, he told me they are LED's which he bought from Rodtiques in Hanover. When I got back home, I never made the time to contact Dave who is the owner till a few weeks ago. After driving home from the New Bedford cruise-in event that night in the Chevelle it reminded me just how bad original sealed beam lights of the 60's and 70's compared to modern lighting. The following day I called Dave and, long-story-short, he made up a set of high and low beam lights for the Chevelle. After installing them and trying them out one night I was sold on the improvement LED's made, that I ordered a set for the Mustang. What a huge improvement they are illuminating the road in front of you. I know a lot of you already have LED's but if you are still using sealed beam headlights, I recommend you look into some LED's as you will not be disappointed. At the same time don't forget the back of your car. If your standard 1157 bulbs are hard to see either with your running lights on or when you apply the brakes, then LED's are also the answer to that problem. I already had a set on the Stang but when I added them to the Chevelle there was a day and night difference, all right I guess pun intended. This is not a promotion for any manufacturer or vendor. All I wanted to do is get you thinking about what your lights are like on your car and do you need to upgrade.

Congratulations to John Buchannan on the sale of "Diamond LiL". I was surprised to hear of the sale but I understand for whatever the reason sometimes a change is needed. Rumor has it that he may be looking to replace the 31 Dodge. If this is true, then happy hunting John.

If you don't regularly work the cruise night, hopefully you can find some time on the 7th to pitch in and help your fellow club members since we will be shorthanded for cruise. 


Hagerty Caffeine & Cars at Heritage Museums

Phil Gardner in England had what was left from a parts Austin-Healey 160880 he imported from the U.S.A. in 1995 to restore a 1956 Austin Healey 100 BN2 for the 50th anniversary of the marque in 2002. That's when Peter who attended the event and Phil hatched a plan to restore Phil's parts hulk rather than scrap


it. Peter would travel to England hauling the needed Healey parts as luggage in addition to shipping the body parts too big to carry. He then spent long weekends in England with Phil on what he calls the shared ownership "coalition project". Somewhere along this project, Peter bought out Phil's share and, after having to repair the A-H 100 after a rear end collision during a test run in England it finally made it home to Massachusetts in 2007. We hear auction houses touting about a vehicle's rarity, original condition, number matching, racing or celebrity provenance being important factors


