On a hot night like our September 7 cruise was, who would have expected to see a highly customized Chevrolet 1 TON L30 Silverado come crab-crawling along the entrance road using its hydraulic articulated steering system, similar to what is used in construction haulers, Well Don Dupras, owner of J & D Auto Repair and Dr. D. In addition to unique features like a drop down ladder needed to climb into the cab, chrome plated water fired fire extinguishers and barrel ice cooler in the truck bed and twin nitrous bottles on the back of the cab used for 15 psi boost to get an additional 150 HP from the LS6 454 "King of the Road" big block V8, the amount of chromed parts, from the radiator cap which started it all to the two 18 gallon gas tanks is just a feast for the eyes. He also hauled this monster truck used at Mount Wachuset. Don's creative talent was well rewarded with the Vintage Motorsports sponsored cruiser of the night plaque. 


2019 World of Wheels



The 1969 Chevelle SS 396 coupes are much sought after because it was a one year post model believed to have been created by the General to compete with the popular Plymouth Road Runners but, with only an estimated 1400 built, these rare models have become much sought after by Chevelle collectors.
