

It is never easy to hear of a passing of a person and having to imagine how they feel but Kathy and Jean should know that the thoughts of the club are with them through this tough time.

On Thursday July 21st a bunch of members gathered in down town New Bedford for a 50's night. This event was held a few years ago but thanks to Covid it was cancelled until this year. There were plenty of cars to see as they lined several blocks which were shut down to traffic with parking for only cruise cars. No matter where you walked you could always hear music due to 6 or 7 bands or DJ's playing on various street corners. I would say everyone who attended enjoyed themselves and will be adding this night to their list of events to attend for next year. A special thanks to Al Provost and Rich Mayo who showed up early to cone out and manage the parking area that was assigned as the Mass Cruisers.

As you know the past cruise night was cancelled due to predicted thunder storms. With a misprint in the released NFL schedule posted in the spring the club was thinking that our August 11th cruise night would be O.K, only to find out this past week that in fact this pre-season game against the Giants is being played at Gillette. No matter how hard we tried we could not convince the NFL to change the location. So we now have another cancellation to deal with. Bob Hines and myself have worked on a makeup cruise night of August 4th as a six week gap between cruises would be too long. The proposed added date was approved by the club at the July meeting. As I was writing the August musings I received an email confirming the August 4th as an official go. Hope to see everyone on the 4th. Since Mark Mango has been working the front entrance leading up to the food pantry donation area he has noticed that there may be a another routing of the cars into the parking rows that would create a better car flow. After he made his presentation Bob and myself told Mark that if he and the rest of the food pantry committee thinks this would help, then to go ahead and implement it whenever they felt the time was right. If by chance this new flow starts to create a huge backup on the main drive into the cruise then they would have to quickly change the entrance back to the way it was. From Marks presentation it appears this will work but there is only one way to find out, that is to try it. This idea should prove that we should not be afraid of making changes if it's for the benefit of the club. This goes for anything that the club does, not just the cruise night. Who knows maybe there is a better mouse trap out there.

On Sunday morning I attended for the first time a cruise-in at the East Bay Grill in down town Plymouth. I didn't realize how big this was. There had to be approximately 500 +/- cars that filled the parking lot in front of the restaurant. What is different from most of the other cruise nights is that this takes place between the hours of 7am to 10am. This is not a misprint as this is a morning event. The lot has to be emptied between 10 and 11am as the restaurant opens at 11 and needs the lot for their patrons. The Rebels and Rods is the club that puts this on. Talking with the clubs president and several of its members I found out that they do a lot of good for the local residents of the town. Their 50/50 and sponsorship donations go to help local families in need. Similar to our club their cruise is put on with a core group of 16 members who show up every Sunday. The ladies are also involved with the operation. I wouldn't arrive any later than 8 as it fills up fast and if you end up in the overflow lot it would be similar to our Bass Pro cruise, you will feel removed from the event. So, if you're an early riser and feel like a drive to the coast then plan on attending some Sunday. The best part of leaving early is that you will miss the Cape traffic. A lot of their members attend our Bass Pro cruise and tell me they take Rt. 106 all the way to Foxboro so you can stay off of the major highways if you prefer cruising the back roads.





# Thank You for Supporting the Local Food Pantries

The great news for our supported local food pantries in Foxboro, Walpole, Wrentham & Attleboro is that our cruise attendees donated a total of \$9,000 in addition to the tons of non perishable food collected at our first four cruise nights in April, May and June. This strong monetary support by Bass Pro Shops cruise atendees resulted in Food Pantry Coordinator John Griffin delivering \$2,250 checks to each of the food pantries in July. July and August are during normal times critical periods for the pantries when needed donations typically slow down and our local school lunch programs are closed for the summer putting a strain on family budgets.

Attleboro's Hebron Food Pantry Vice President, Heather Porreca, was on hand at our June 30 cruise to receive the first of the early season proceeds checks which comes at this critical point of need. Their food pantry has experienced an increase in 755 new patrons from two years previous. The increase in demand coincides with increases in the cost of food staples like cheese (94%), chicken (60%) and pasta (56%) during this post-pandemic inflationary period. Additionally, the Boston Food Bank rationing of sup-

plies area food pantries rely on. Your \$1 donation allows food pantries to purchase \$20 retail equivalent of food staples from the Boston Area Food Bank that allows them to fill their shelves with needed items not donated or collected at food drives as well as dated-coded and perishable foods requiring refrigeration.

As we continue with the cruises in August, Stoughton's St. Anthony's Free Market will become our fifth supported local food pantry in 2022.







Also, check out the THANK YOU commemorative bottle opener key tags available at the club trailer for a donation of \$5 or more. 100% of these donations go to the <u>Vocational Workforce Tool Grant Program</u>.



## **JULY ,A MIXED WEATHER BAG** of Events





# "Joe Jesus" 50's Night Tribute Cruise

For those of you not familiar with downtown New Bedford's annual "Joe Jesus 50's Cruise Night" that was always held on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday each July, Joe, who along with his late good buddy George Oliveira, musician and 6th Bristol Club owner, were the heart and soul that organized and coordinated this cruising musical feast that featured downtown New Bedford's closed-to-traffic streets lined with parked vintage cars & hot rods with five entertainment stages keeping the live performance 50's and '60's music alive all afternoon into the evening. Joe Jesus died in March 2019 and the July 2019 Thursday 50's Night was in conflict with our own Bass Pro Shops cruise so we stayed home. That 2019 50's cruise was shortened due to the mosquito EEE virus scare that summer.

For the resurrected 2022 Joe Jesus 50's Cruise Night, it was an anonymous benefactor that came forward with funding to bring this popular event back. With no Bass Pro Shops cruise night conflict this year, our own Mass Cruisers club members were able to join other participating local car club members from the Downshifters, Cuz's, Legendary Street Rods and Mass. Corvettes by having a dozen reserved parking spaces along Union Street while all other car owners attending parked wherever they could find an open spot along the five closed off downtown blocks. While most of Massachusetts and Rhode Isnad were suffering from the continued 90 degree heat wave, a Southwest breeze coming off New Bedford Harbor kept us in the comfortable low 80's. A great time was enjoyed by all that attended for this resurrected tribute year. \$5 donation buckets were visible at the cruise entrances and the five entertainment stages with hopes that there will be enough donations collected to continue the tradition again next year.


