

### **IMPA TEST DAYS 2021**

On September 28<sup>th</sup> of this past year 2021, I experienced a driving enthusiast's dream: To drive my choice of dozens of brand-new cars on the open road, unescorted. This event was hosted by the International Motor Press Association (IMPA). The leadership of this group of professional automotive writers arranged to have both foreign and domestic manufacturers provide their newest models for us to test, often the "Halo car" of the company.

Upon arrival at Bear Mountain State Park in Bear Mountain, New York, registered members credentials were examined, and we were issued a wrist band indicating our membership in the association. As this was my first Test Day I inquired as to what was expected of us. The reply was that we could drive any of the forty something vehicles with the only guideline being that we were asked to return the vehicle after approximately fifteen minutes. Since a list of vehicles had been sent to each member prior to the

event, most of us knew which vehicles we wanted to drive before we arrived. On and off rain showers did little to deter our enthusiastic road testing.

After a tasty breakfast, we headed to the parking lot to begin the test drives. I headed straight to the Cadillac CT4-V Blackwing and chose the 6-speed manual over the automatic, as one of each was present. WOW! Does that machine move! What an exciting way to begin the day, blasting along the twisting, undulating roads of the state park. I selected a road upon which there were no places for spoilsports to hide and I may have taken advantage of that. This car is so fast I needed only the first three of the six gears! If you haven't driven a Cadillac lately you might want to try this one.







One unusual ride I enjoyed was the Mustang Mach E. It was the first electric car I had ever driven. The gentleman representing Ford told me he programed the car to run in "one pedal mode." Step on the accelerator and you go faster. Take your foot off the accelerator and the vehicle slows due to the regenerative feature which turns your momentum into electricity, slowing down the vehicle. It was much easier to get used to than I had expected. However, charging downhill into a turn is an act of faith. I think many of us would prefer to apply the brake ourselves than trust a computer to decide the degree of braking applied. I also didn't care to be the only automotive journalist that day to demolish a brand-new car.

Among the many vehicles I drove were the latest C8 Corvette, a Lexus LS500, a Mini Cooper S Convertible, a Hyundai Santa Cruz pickup, and a Subaru Outback Wilderness Edition.

But the ride which really made it worth the 400-mile round-trip to Bear Mountain was the MAYBACH! Never did I believe I would have the privilege of piloting this Mercedes Benz produced, ultra-luxury, \$250K car up and down a country road seeing what it could do. This was a real, "pinch me, I think I'm dreaming," experience. Glove-soft leather, every amenity you could imagine and POWER! This car was intended to be sold to world leaders, professional athletes, and Hollywood A-listers, and here I was, a retired schoolteacher/ charter coach driver, the son of a factory worker, basking in a level of luxury very few ever experience. Life

is GOOD!

In conclusion, my observation is that Today's new cars are universally excellent. I could be happy with almost any of these cars, trucks, or SUVs. Years ago, we worried that we might select a car which was a "lemon." Since today's vehicles are consistently so much more reliable than those of the 50's and 60's that is no longer a consideration. Style, features, and how you intend to use your vehicle now play a much larger role in selection of which car to purchase.



The organizers of this IMPA Test Day event had encouraged participants to arrive in one of their collector cars to put on a mini show. The weather discouraged many from doing so, but a small intrepid group braved the elements and displayed their cars. As if this wasn't already a red-letter day for me, late in the afternoon I was informed my '68 DeVille convertible won the Judge's Choice award! I eagerly look forward to the 2022 version of IMPA Test Day.




# Mark's Motorsports EXPO

I find that every year Mark's Northeast Motorsports EXPO at the Eastern States Exposition center in Springfield, MA is worth the trip. It has a great mix of vehicles covering a wide spectrum of the auto enthusiast hobby. For us in the eastern part of Massachusetts, who never quite make it to, let alone over the Connecticut River, it is a treat to see the vehicles and owners from the valley region display their cars.

Every year there is one craftsman displaying at the show amazing me with their handiwork. One such gentleman was William Eggers from Goshen, CT, a retired builder of Private Collection Vehicles, who displayed two of his replica motorcycles; the first successful steam motorized motorcycle, an 1867 Roper Velocipede (original is locked away in the Smithsonian), and the first gas powered motorcycle, an 1885 Daimler Reitwagen, which he had to scale off photographs. In addition to the two replica motorcycles displayed at the show, he also built five additional replicas of each which he sells to collectors. Bill is one interesting guy to know. He says, "I build limited edition and one-of-a-kind works of art; I don't do restorations." You can see the extent of Bill's craftsmanship by visiting his website at:

There is also a video link showing Bill demonstrating how the 1885 Daimler motorcycle works and then rides it over to pick up the mail.


