



2022 Mecum Kissimmee Auction

The Mecum Kissimmee Auction held at the Osceola Heritage Park Fairgrounds in Kissimmee, Florida kicked off the new year with 2,954 collector cars being sold at auction for a record setting \$213 million while enjoying a 85% sell-through rate from the 3,500 presented. Mecum Kissimmee continues to hold the enviable position of being the world's largest and most successful collector car auction and I have attended them for the past few years during my January vacation time away from our New England winters. It is amazing how well organized this event is. Mecum, unlike the Barrett-Jackson auctions, allows a reserve price. The Heritage Park Fairgrounds accommodates, an auction hall (as seen on TV), approximately 16 pavilions housing the auction cars, a large food & entertainment area, many vendors and shuttles running to and from all the venues. Vehicles that do not meet their reserve price inside the auction hall are labeled "THE BID GOES ON" and are moved into a display lot where you can view them and bid again if desired. All the grounds and event areas are open to the public. Admission is \$20 before the auction start date on Thursday and \$30 on auction days through Sunday. There is a bidder and seller fees of 10% added onto each sale.

Although the premier car going on the block at this year's 2022 auction was the Prototype Ken Miles 1965 Shelby GT350R "Flying Mustang", me being a classic 1957 Mercury Monterey Convertible owner, I was excited even further learning the 1951 "Hirohata" Mercury was also going on the auction block. This ground breaking custom Mercury was built for Robert "Bob" Hirohata by the team at Barris Kustoms in 1952 after Bob saw a top chop done by George Barris on a 1949 Mercury. Hirohata's 1951 Mercury went on to dominate the car show circuit, grace magazine covers, and eventually see some motion picture work. He later sold the Merc in 1955 and in 1959 it was eventually found in a used car lot by 16-year-old Jim McNeil who bought it for \$500. Jim got it back on the road then put it into storage, bringing it out in 1988 for a full restoration under the watchful eyes of the late George Barris. The Merc continued to be shown as a show car and was added to the National Historic Vehicle Register in 2017. Jim died in 2018, but the car remained in the family until now when Wayne Carini was brought into the picture to help the McNeil family bring this historic Merc to the Mecum Kissimmee Auction

For those of us not fortunate enough as Fred to be down in Florida to see first hand some of these amazing cars going across the auction block, Mecum streams live broadcasts of all their auctions and the Saturday auction was as good as it gets. In addition to watching the highly anticipated Hirohata Mercury cross the stage to be bid up to an unanticipated twice the \$1.1 million reserve price, the historic 1965 Ken Miles GT350R Shelby Mustang, one of the two GT350R prototypes built to race in the SCCAC Production class for its first win at Green Valley Raceway in Smithfield, Texas was the star and top seller at this year's auction. My interest in Mustangs springs from my own experience completing the restoration of a 1965 Mustang with my then 16 year old son Mark back in 1980 which he then used as his daily driver in High School until starting college two years later.

Caroll Shelby sold the GT350R in 1966 for \$4,000 to a Ford engineer Bill Clawson who raced it for another year before it was traded and it continued being raced until ending up in the Shelby American Museum in Boulder, CO. There it sat for another 14 years when a Shelby collector bought it and had it restored to its original SCCAC race condition. He sold it at the Mecum 2020 Indy auction for \$3.85 million garnering the title as the world's most valuable Mustang. And here it is in 2022 at Kissimmee set-







There were a few other cars crossing the auction block that caught my interest. One, a 1969 DeTomasso Mangusta, one of 401 built from 1967 to 1971, sold for \$440,000.

Another interesting car was a very rare one of 32 recently restored 1956 Chevrolet Morocco that was





sold for \$220,000. We saw a similar black Morocco at the 2021 Old Orchard Beach Show.

After the 2020 cruise year events were cancelled due to the pandemic, Lorna noted that she had to adjust her selection from who she would have picked last year. She also noted that the perpetual plaque that has all the previous COTYA winners engraved on it is now filled up and has no more room for adding subsequent year selections. She's already discussed suggested ideas with our award supplier Rainbow Creations and Joe Filipi said he will be able to rehab the plaque in one way or another. So further discussion for coming up with a solution in time before the 2023 Annual Meeting. Also, because we no longer have a clubhouse wall to display the plaque, Steve Huntington volunteered to follow up on suggestions to have it prominently displayed on the club trailer at all our Cruise Nights. Rich Armando then closed the meeting by passing out the thank you gifts to members that worked the 2021 AutoFest.

Just a heads up for future meetings in the Bass Pro Shops Conservation Room. We are all set for

2022 except for the month of December when it is not available. This may be an opportunity to try some-

thing different for the holiday season.





