1956 Mercury XM Turnpike Cruiser at MECUM By Fred Tierney



My annual January vacation in Florida coincides with the annual Mecum Auctions giant Kissimmee event that I attend each year as our club's correspondent for our monthly newsletter and this year's auction was particularly exciting for me because the recent extensively restored concept 1956 Mercury XM Turnpike Cruiser was in the auction. The concept 1956 Mercury XM was designed by Mercury and originally Constructed by Ghia in Italy. The restoration was closely followed by Old Cars Weekly readers like me and it was scheduled for the auction block in Kissimmee, FL on January 14 at the Osceola Heritage Park auction venue. It is huge with display tents for each of the eleven auction days, a food court, free Dodge thrill rides, Auction Block building, Bid Goes On lot, vehicle collections display, vendor displays, show stage and on and on. The 4,000 auction vehicles are all available for viewing and are displayed together based upon the day they are scheduled to be auctioned. Each vehicle has a label stating the vehicle information, the day it will run, a lot number and an estimated price range.

My brother in-law and his brother went with me on Wed. Jan. 12 but you really need two days to see and experience this event. Because of the pre-auction estimate for the Mercury XM was \$1,250,000– \$2,000,00 and the publicity about the restoration, I expected it to be showcased with the featured cars, but I had a hard time trying to find it and, when I found it, it was parked in the January 14 tent among all

the other line up of cars that were scheduled to hit the auction block on Friday. I snapped some pictures, then after the auction results were posted following the auction, was surprised to learn it wasn't sold and was relegated to the BID GOES ON lot with a last bid price of \$350,000. Compared this to last year's heavily pre-sale and on-site promotion efforts by the McNeil family to enlist Wayne Carini for the Custom Hirohito 1951 Mercury that sold for \$2,145,000, twice its pre-sale estimate. It points out the importance of going the extra mile to build the excitement among potential bidders at big auction events like the Mecum Auctions.

I'll be back next year; See you there in 2024.

The Mecum Kissimmee auction is always a bell weather auction in several ways. It is the first major auction in the new year. It is also the largest collector car auction in the world both in terms of number of cars and dollar sales. And this year their Kissimmee auction broke both records with over 4,000 cars generating \$234 million. The less-than-spectacular best bid of \$350,000 for the 1956 concept Mercury Turnpike Cruiser was to Fred Tierney, equally surprising to me was the \$1.1 million price paid for the 1970 Pontiac GTO Judge. Our Peluso Precision Automotive Bass Pro Shops cruise sponsor Steve Peluso, a well known local Poncho owner/collector/enthusiast, must be grinning from ear to ear. And what about the initial \$1,430,000 reported SOLD prices for each of the two 1969 Dodge Hemi Daytona's and that 1966 Shelby 427 Cobra. Perhaps there is a reason why there was a popular MSRP-like price limit placed for them. If you are like me though, I enjoy going through auction sales results to look for any similar cars to my own '61 Impala bubble top. The '61 that was SOLD at the Kissimmee auction went for \$110,000 and it was not a rare Impala SS Sport Coupe, but a recent nicely restored non-numbers matching bubble top. I'm smiling too! By the way, if you want a better perspective on real world values for your proud rides, the OLD CARS REPORT PRICE GUIDE from 1925-1970 is in the February 1, 2023 issue of Old Cars magazine.



The 2021/22 Massachusetts 192nd Massachusetts General Court ended having heard 8.626 bills that were introduced with 524 making it through to passage with 9 of them being vetoed. None of the bills of interest that M.A.A.C. (Massachusetts Association of Auto Clubs) was monitoring and/or supporting made it through the session, so the process of resubmitting old and new bills begins all over again this January. Your M.A.A.C. Board is closely monitoring this new batch of bills being submitted to the 193rd General Court Clerk's office and will, once again, review the proposed bills as they are submitted categorizing them based on their impact to the car hobby. Bills that promote, benefit or improve our car hobby interests are denoted as "supported." Bills that will have a detrimental impact on the hobby or could harm it are denoted as "not supported." Bills that do not directly affect the hobby but are important for the public to be aware of, are denoted as "Watching". When bills of interest are assigned to the appropriate committee and scheduled for a public hearing, MAAC will try to attend and testify based on our interests. The best way for you and your club to keep informed as to what is happening on Beacon Hill is to monitor the M.A.A.C. website periodically Massachusetts Association of Auto Clubs - "PROMOTING THE INTERESTS OF THE HOBBY" (massautoclubs.org) where updates will be posted. The M.A.A.C. website is also the new home for Jack Malcom's former Maynard Area Auto Club's favored listing of New England events that auto enthusiast's have used for more than 30 years when looking for upcoming car shows, cruises and swap meets. Also, there is a spring M.A.A.C. meeting planned to be held on April 20 in the Bass Pro Shops Conservation Room, coinciding with our Mass Cruisers opening cruise night so you can attend the cruise and stop inside the Bass Pro Shops to the M.A.A.C. meeting. While you are at it, if your club is not yet a member of M.A.A.C., download the membership application from the website and pass the hat to collect \$20 for yearly dues and identify a fellow club member and alternate to represent your club to keep your fellow club members informed about what's happening on Beacon Hill that could impact our hobby interests.
