## August 29 Cruise Winner 1933 F5R "Speedstar" Coupe

There was anywhere from 35 to 40 Factory Five Forum members participating in their annual Bass Pro Shops cruise to Patriot Place, driving an amazing array of different owner-built Factory Five kit cars. Dave Smith's daughter Nicole was charged with having their staff select a favorite Forum Member build project to receive a Vintage Motorsports Cruise Award Plaque. David Clément's 1933 Hot Rod "Speedstar" Coupe in Sunset Orange Pearl paint was selected. This 5.7 Liter HEMI powered coupe is backed with a Tremec 5 speed tranny and 8.8 Mustang rear end, rolls on American Racing Wheels with 305/35/20 General GMax Ultra High-Performance All-Season tires driving from the rear and 255-40-18 up front. Factory Five purchased Rat's Glass Ridler Award winning design "Speedstar" molds & tooling back in

2018 with the intent to fit it to their own high performance chassis design used for the 1935 Hot Rod Truck. It was débuted as the 2nd Generation of their successful 1933 line of hot rods introduced at SEMA in 2015. I asked David, who completed the 21-month build project in June this year, why



he specifically wanted to build this F5R model, and he commented it provided the legroom and comfortable seating for his 6 ft. frame.













# August 29 Cruise Winner 1957 Chevrolet BelAir

## August 29 Cruise Winner 1971 Land Rover II 109

It isn't always the recently restored or museum quality show car that gets selected to be one of the Vintage Motorsports Cruise Award Plaques winners at our Bass Pro Shops cruise. A great example is this 1971 Land Rover Series II  $1094 \times 4$  sporting a Safari Soft Top that would look more at home on the Serengeti than New England highways.

Owner Liam Farrell from Medfield has owned this original condition Rover, except for some new seats, since aged 15 and he regularly makes trips to Nantucket & the Vineyard every year having put over 2,000 miles on her so far this summer. The interior rear seating classifies this as a 10 passenger 3 door vehicle with the addition of the rear entrance. It is powered by a venerable 2286 cc 4-cyl. diesel back with a 4-spd manual tranny & Hi-Lo range shifter is no world beater on the interstate but nimble enough for fun on the Cape's dunes. And for this dare-to-be-different cruise car attendee, Liam's flowered summer shirt and sunglasses also sets the vibe.









## August 29 Cruise Winner 1934 Ford 5-Window Coupe

Paul DiFilippo's 14-year build project on his stunning PPG Black 1934 Ford five-window coupe started with an old steel body, rotted in many areas, missing the firewall and filled with plenty of evidence its former final life was being used for target practice. Typically, true hot rodders visualize its final future look, rather than just how they're going to patch it back together. His vision came from a Dave Bell illustration thanks to a previous radical 6-inch top chop to the old body. The floor, sub-rails and trunk had to be refabricated along with adding a custom modified factory firewall. A custom '34 style grill and rear roll pan were added that allows you peek underneath to see it's as finished there as it is topside. The white Cadillac leather interior and taupe carpeting is complemented with the moldings and dash being finished with a bird's eye maple hydrostatic dip. The '34 is motivated with a Big Al's Toy Box Littlefield supercharged 355ci small block V8 that dyno's out at 560-580 hp via a Richmond five-speed tranny & 3:55 Ford 9 in. rear. I noticed Paul had parked the '34 straddling two parking spaces to protect it from potential harm while at the cruise. But with the number of families that attend our cruise that extra room only invites more attention, particularly for curious kids to do what kids do, and some very anxious moments for Paul while watching over his Vintage Motorsports Cruise Award winning ride. As a former 1934 Chopped 5 Win-

dow coupe owner, thanks for letting me see what could have been achieved with the right vision and resources.
