Cruisin' at the speed of fun MECUM Kissimmee 2025

The goal for this year's 2025 Mecum Auction held at the Osceola Heritage Park in Kissimmee, Florida, was 4,500 vehicles to cross the block to maintain its reputation as the "World's Largest Collector Car Auction" and, by all reports, there were 4,400 consignments for this year's January 7–18 auction making it the King of the collector car auctions. Every car imaginable from a George Barris/Dean Jeffries built 1953 Oldsmobile Custom Convertible, a.k.a. "AZTEC", that was a featured Chip Foose barn find on his YouTube channel to a 1966 Ford GT40 MkI Road Car that was the top seller at \$6,300,000. I saw some very good buys that were shown earlier in the auction. My favorite buy of the auction was a 2018 BMW 430i Series Convertible that was sold for \$17,000 on Tuesday.

One of the features at Mecum which allows reserve prices on many cars that were not sold during their one minute of fame on the auction block is to move them to the "bid goes on" areas where cars like the Barris Olds which was a no sale at \$75,000 while I was there was finally reported later sold at \$325,000. One local car I was able to track down was Jerry Richmond's 1932 Auburn Boattail Speedster that was included with the Larry Spellman (North Country Auctions) 24 car collection consignment. The Auburn did go on the block Saturday afternoon, a prime auction time, and found a new owner for \$297,000. In addition to being a great auction to experience with the huge number of high quality vehicles consigned to this auction, it is truly a great car show to see these vehicles up close and in some cases get to talk with their owners. I am sure to make it again next year.

It was last January 2024 when our Mass Cruisers Car Club members attended the monthly Car Craft coffee open-house at Abe's Garage in Brockton when I brought my then, 11 year old great-grandson Brad, with me for his first cars & coffee experience. Abe's is also one of our Bass Pro Shops cruise major sponsors and brothers Ted & Ben Resnikoff, owners of Abe's Garage, open up their facility during the offcruising and car show season on the third Sunday afternoon each month so their customers, who use this unique storage facility to build their own dream projects, can display and share their project progress with other auto enthusiasts.

Brad is now 12 years old and was not only looking forward to the free coffee and donuts at Abe's following attending the Sunday morning church service, but he was armed with his Kodak PIXPRO Digital Camera ready to explore and take pictures and videos of his favorite cars. And that he did. When I tracked him down, he was lurking around the lower garage level sneaking pictures of a 1986 Jeep CJ-7 project build that owner Jason was working on. It is a complete total frame-off restoration with a performance rebuild of the 350 V8 that came with it when he bought it. 1986 was the final year of the Civilian Jeep series of open bodied 4 x 4 offroad CJ's that evolved from the legendary WW-II Jeep. And Brad fell in love with this CJ-7 project asking Jason questions while making his first video interview which I uploaded to his own OneDrive folder that he can access.
