

Every two years there's a January ritual on Beacon Hill when the citizens in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts can submit new or previously tabled bills through their legislators that will be assigned to the responsible joint legislative committees that will hold public hearings at the State House in Boston on the merits for their passage into law. Because the process of deliberations is slow and the number of bills being considered so large, in the multiple of thousands, the chances of a typical bill's passage is slim to none without some inside help. I have been submitting a bill to designate U.S. Routes 1, 6 & 20 as historic U.S. Routes for the past six General Courts. Passage would allow historic route signage to be erected on them as it is done in many of the states these routes pass through, The 100th Anniversary of the Interstate Highway System which was created in 1926 happens next year, These three routes in Massachusetts, Rtes. 1,6 & 20 were part of the system. Both U.S. Routes 6 and 20 originate in Massachusetts, Provincetown and Boston, traversing coast to coast with U.S. Route 20 ending in Newport Oregon at the junction of the Pacific Coast Highway while passing through Yellowstone National Park and U.S. Route 6 originally ending in Long Beach, California but now in Bishop just over the line from Nevada at the edge of the Northern Mohave Desert. These are the two longest transcontinental highways in North America and are pretty much intact today. U.S. Route 1 is the longest North South highway in America that still passes through downtown Boston and Providence. I've attended all the public hearings held by the Joint Transportation Committee to present supporting documentation and, during one General Court the bill was passed by the House but died in the Senate Ways and Means Committee before the session ended, I have since given up trying. Although U.S. Route 66 gets all the attention from "Road Tourians", Internationally as well, Route 6 supporters still say," Route 6 has half the digits but twice the kicks as Route 66". On the Road: Finally, respect for Route 6

The winter Sunday February 16 monthly Abe's Garage Car Craft afternoon coffee & donuts open house was preceded by with over two inches of snow followed by a transition to freezing rain in the morning to rain all afternoon long which meant there was plenty of left over Dunkin donuts and coffee. That didn't keep the Garage tenants from working on their projects inside and under cover. One of the projects being worked on that held my interest was a GM 6-speed 4WD transmission being converted to 2WD. One of the garage tenants, Aidan, who has a Phoenix-like restoration project of his own underway with his 1977 280Z has a friend Jonathan who was in need of a replacement engine and transmission for his 1988 Monte Carlo. Another Garage tenant was replacing the 5.3L V8 & 6L80 4WD in his project 2011 Silverado pickup truck and had it for sale. The deal was made and Aidan, who has the mechanic's skill and Jonathan had that 6L80 tranny all apart on the bench when me and my 12 year old Great-Grandson Brad showed up in the afternoon for some DD coffee & donuts. They were swapping out the 4WD output shaft and housing and relacing it with a 2WD output shaft kit. The beauty of personally doing a swap like this allows examining closely known 2011 Silverado 6-speed transmission problem areas and addressing them when reassembling it with the new 2WD kit.

2025 Beacon Hill Watch Update

Being our club's representative to Massachusetts Association of Auto Clubs (M.A.A.C.), I am asked at each monthly meeting for a M.A.A.C. update. M.A.A.C. is our hobby's watchdog for anything new happening on Beacon Hill that could impact our hobby interests and the organization is made up of volunteers, mainly from several of the 300 Massachusetts Car Clubs and their 40,000 members. I am also one of the seven M.A.A.C. Board of Directors, and there is currently a Board vacancy that needs to be filled, Interested? Every two years new legislation is submitted to the General Court which was convened recently on January 1 as new and returning senators and representatives are sworn into the 2025-2026 194th General Court session. M.A.A.C. sorted through the several thousand bills that communities, organizations and constituents had submitted through State Representatives and Senators on January 22 to identify those "Bills of Interest" to us which will be reviewed and categorized based on their impact to the car hobby. This summary list of Bills will be categorized as follows: Bills that promote or improve the car hobby are denoted as "SUPPORTED". Bills that will have a detrimental impact on the hobby are denoted as "NOT **SUPPORTED".** Bills that do not directly affect the hobby but are important for the public to be aware of, are denoted as "WATCHING" and can be followed on the M.A.A.C. website: Bills of Interest - Massachusetts Association of Auto Clubs Where February is a slow event activity month to report about, I've posted the bills that we will be reviewing so that you will also have the opportunity to do your own due-diligence and get in touch with your State Representative or Senator or club's M.A.A.C. representative. Although M.A.A.C. has yet to review these bills to determine their impact, this preliminary list of bills was provided to Board members in advance of the meeting that will determine their impact and also identify which bills will need to be addressed in person when public hearings are held on Beacon Hill.
