Bob Walton and I attended the September 2022 International Motor Press Association Test Day at Bear Mountain State Park in New York. We had the opportunity to test drive a diverse sampling of 2023 cars and trucks over the park's mountain roads. Noticeably missing were offerings from General Motors. None of the vehicles Manufacturers brought to this annual event were their lowest cost economy models but were typically their newest model offerings that were heavily optioned. Examples were Ford's 2023 Mustang GT 500 Cobra and F-150 Lightning all-electric \$80,000 pickup truck and Hyundai's G90 twin-turbo V6 AWD luxury sedan that optioned out for a whopping \$97,000. While Bob attended these IMPA events over the past few years, I haven't done one in more than twelve years when they were previously held at the Pocono Raceway in Pennsylvania. Except for the occasional experience driving a new vehicle as a rental, this was the first time I've been able to drive a full range of EV's and advanced turbo-powered gas cars and trucks. Although these were all amazingly comfortable and fun to drive, nothing I drove had a

Monroney window sticker price under, GULP, \$70,000. Also, mindful of the recent shortage of microchips used in today's cars and trucks delaying deliveries of optioned models, it was also mind-blowing to learn that Ford's Lightning F-150 has between 1500 and 1700 of them, not the hundreds or so computer microchips we've been hearing about used in today's cars. That, along with the lithium battery supply being able to keep up with growing EV demand and the fast evolutionary pace of EV technology, this has to be concerning about hanging on to one of these EV's longer than a 3 year lease term.


