August 4 Cruise Winner 1959 Chevrolet Biscayne

Scott Morrell just picked up his 1959 Chevrolet Biscayne RestoRod Cruiser two days earlier, so our August 4th cruise was its first shakedown event. When he was notified that his car was selected for the Vintage Motor Sports cruise award, he was proving the importance of those first "shakedown cruises" as he was in process of replacing the lower radiator hose which was leaking coolant. Our Entrance and Food Pantry Team of John Griffon, Mark Murgo and Bob Walton were charged with the pick and weren't aware the crowd gathering around the car was assisting Scott or spectating his repair progress. However, this is a unique Chevy, dubbed 'BIS-QUICK" by its Oakland, CA builder due to the unusual power train. This entry level 2 door post '59 Chevy was inspired by the 40 Zora Arkus-Duntov-spec 348 V8 police pursuit cars built at the Oakland GM plant back in the day. Scott's 348 power plant is updated considerably with Edelbrock 409 aluminum heads and also has a 5 speed Tremec tranny. It also has 4-wheel disc brakes and custom Boyd Coddington 5 spoke alloy wheels along with stunning custom three-tone Oldsmobile Starfire upholstered interior and that compliments a flawless copper two-tone paint finish. 50/50 Vocational Student Workforce Tool Grants

In addition to our traditional 50/50 charitable program support for the Wrentham Development Center's resident programs and the Southeastern Massachusetts AMVETS Region program for the Brockton VA Hospital patients, we have added a new program in 2022 that focuses on our vocational student needs when entering their first employment opportunities or advanced training needs in the automotive services fields following graduation. The program provides \$250 cash grants to deserving graduates from Norfolk County Agricultural, Tri-County Regional, Southeastern Regional and Blue Hills Regional High Schools. An example of one of he first grants made was to a 2022 graduating Tri-County senior who will be applying it to continuing his post graduate education in diesel mechanics. Additional changes we are implementing in the 50-50 charity programs is ticket pricing:, and more importantly, you do not have to be present when your ticket is drawn. Your name and ticket # will be held, so don't throw it away or forget to bring it with you to the next cruise.

In addition to proceeds from the 50-50, complimentary Cruise and Mass Cruisers logo key tags are given for direct donations of \$5 or more to the Workforce Tool Grant Program. The key tags are available at the club trailer where the event T shirts are sold. I am excited about bringing this new workforce grant program to our area Technical Vocational Schools and am hopeful that our fellow auto enthusiast car owners will be able to help support these future technicians get a fresh start in their new careers.





Another surprising exhibit by Hamilton Standard in the mezzanine area was hosted by Don Rethke, a.k.a. "Dr. FLUSH", who designed the shuttle zero gravity flush toilet. 
AUGUST CRUISING AROUND






