"Right to Repair Law" in Massachusetts; where are we? After seeing years of Right to Repair bills being tabled by our Massachusetts Legislators at the end of each General Court session, the 2020 Right to Repair Question 1 initiative was passed by 3/4 of our state's voters which was then enacted as a state statute (Chapter 93J). This updated existing state's right to repair laws to include electronic vehicle data by allowing vehicle owners and independent repair facilities access to mechanical data related to vehicle maintenance and repair. Also, starting with vehicle model year 2022, the law would require manufacturers of vehicles equipped with telemetrics systems that collect and transmit data wirelessly being sold in Massachusetts to provide an open access platform. To avoid this requirement, Subaru stopped including their Starlink and Kia their Connect telemetrics in their 2022 vehicles sold in Massachusetts. The Alliance for Automotive Innovation had also filed a suit in November 2020 to stop the law and while former Attorney General, now Governor, Maura Healy did little to enforce the law over the following two years, our new Attorney General Andrea Campbell filed a notice Intent to Terminate the Non-Enforcement Stipulation with enforcement of the state statute to start on June 1, 2023.

Contradicting that Judicial Order, The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) notified 22 automakers to ignore Massachusetts Right-to-Repair Law on June 13 citing safety and security concerns that such open access could potentially be used by thieves and hackers to remotely command vehicles and also gain access to car owners personal information used by the auto dealer's service departments. On June 16 Senators Markey and Warren asked Transportation Secretary Buttigieg and NHSTA Deputy Administrator Sophie Schulman to have NHTSA to reverse course,

What could happen next? For one, it's possible a Federal Judge could intervene to prevent enforcement and it's a good bet that 22 automakers can find one somewhere to support their position. Also, there doesn't appear to be evidence automakers, on their own, have done anything to harden their telemetrics vulnerabilities since the Massachusetts Right to Repair Law was passed. Further there is obviously a lack of government agency pressure requiring automotive manufacturers to do so.

With the heavy showing of some 35 Cadillacs at the June 1 cruise by New England Region Cadillac LaSalle club members it wasn't all that surprising when out of the hundreds of other cars and trucks attending it was a stunning black 1958 Cadillac Series 62 2-door Sedan, owned by Tim & Laurie O'Conner of Berkley, MA, that was singled out for the Vintage Motorsports sponsored Cruiser of the night award plaque. What was surprising when asking Tim and Laurie about details of their Cadillac, it was Laurie who was rattling off the specifications and details like, of the 121,778 Cadillacs produced in 1958, 7,825 were the Series 62 models. Come to find out she volunteers at the Newport Car Museum in Portsmouth, R.I. after a chance visit there on their way to Newport. This then led them to purchase their 1958 Caddy two years ago. The Caddy is powered by a 365 cu. in (6.0 L) V8 coupled to a four speed hydromantic transmission. With its tubular X frame chassis without side rails, the car enjoys a lower body style without loss of interior space. These were luxurious riding land yachts back in the day.. The 1958 Cadillac's fin design epitomizes the fin era that Harley Earl started in 1948 and was continued by Bill Mitchell until ending in 1964. Congrats to Tim & Laurie.
