

Evan Brastow, President of his new venture Overland Filmworks, started off his presentation at our March 19 Monthly meeting by explaining his experience as a child listening to his dad's stories about his cars. In particular was his dad's favorite 1959 Plymouth Sport Fury and the modifications he made, and the trips he made in that car were the legendary memories Evan wished could have been preserved using today's video technology. This turned out to be an "Aha!" moment for Evan several years ago while he was on one of his test rides on MOM's Foxboro store's latest model motorcycles using his latest passion, video photography, and posting them on his YouTube motorcycle blog.

Evan then began a long process over the past few years of expanding his vision by clearing out a portion of his family's 61 Green Street manufacturing facility for an inside studio with lighting and an address, "Suite 2C"; purchasing a Mercedes-Benz Sprinter Van and outfitting it for use as a rolling filming studio for onsite outdoor photo and video production shoots.

Evan passed out a nice brochure detailing the four production packages he offers, Standard, Deluxe, Sport & Premium, either inside or outdoor, or on-location shoots at your home or garage. Evan also provided discount pricing that our March meeting members could take advantage of before our April 18 opening Bass Pro Shops cruise night. Although interrupted in getting his OVERLAND FILMWORKS venture due to some unexpected health issues in 2023, we can expect to see Evan and his van showing up at our 2024 Bass

Bob Slater was the guest speaker at our December 19, 2023 monthly meeting when he detailed plans for the all new World On Wheels Showcase as part of the March 22-24, 2024 New England Home Show at the Gillette Stadium Field House, now called the Waste Innovation Field House, and how our invited Mass Cruisers Auto Club can participate. Although we were well prepared to have a vendor booth setup for the club as well as additional space to showcase a revived Small Engine Build-Off competition between the Blue Hills Technical, Norfolk County Agricultural and Southeast-ern Vocational Technical High Schools that will be fielding four teams each on Saturday and Sunday, additional space for displaying five club member cars was available nearby. The 60,000 square foot interior of the Field House has a synthetic turf field for the Patriots to practice indoor during inclement weather and is covered with interlocking panels that need to be covered by rugs or protecting covering. Work by members volunteering on Thursday before the noon time FREE Friday opening was challenging but hard work by everyone on Thursday and Friday morning pulled it off, however there was one last minute effort by John Ricker who came up with many yards of exhibition carpeting and protective stanchions with roping that saved the day for our last minute show car display area. When the doors opened at noon on Friday our space at the West wall area of the Field House looked about as professional as any of the Home Show exhibitors.




