# **JULY 11 CRUISE WINNER FACTORY FIVE MK-4**

As you walk around John Webster's Factory Five MK-4 Roadster, one of the two Vintage Motorsports cruise winners at our July 11 cruise, you notice details that are unique to this 12-month build-project unlike many of the Factory Five MK series roadsters that regularly attend our cruise. Most obvious is the splash/siphon guard surrounding the polished aluminum Shelby Cobra Style Gas Cap and its 289 kit location behind the passenger seat. Then you look over to the Petty roll bar and notice the speedo is also mounted on the passenger side along with a replica Shelby American COBRA tag. You now understand that John, not only built his first MK-4 Roadster, he made it a tribute replica of the famous 1965 era Carroll Shelby 289 Cobra's along with their added FIA optioned rule features like the trunk dimples for a required 24" x 16" x 8" suitcase and drilled bungee cord holes to keep the poorly latched trunk from flying open when racing. Shelby only built 5 USRRC/FIA 289's for racing with only two know to exit today, making this MK-4 very unique. However, not wanting an older drive train for reliability and performance, John chose the venerable Boss 302 V8 that dyno's out at 355 HP & 346 Ft. Lb. torque and is backed by a Tremec T-5 tranny & mid-shift kit, Moser rear w. 3.55 gears & Koni coil overs with 3- link rear and double A arms up front. He also added heated seat kits for those cool New England morning drives to car shows.

I don't think there were too many that missed seeing Scott Morrell wheeling into our July 11 Bass Pro Shops cruise with their Milford Auto Sales recent Barrett Jackson California Auction acquisition, a combination 1952 Ford Mainline Ranch Wagon towing its rare matching Kompak Sportsman Trailer. As a result, it was picked for one of our two Vintage Motorsports cruiser awards. The trailer has it all for the outdoorsman. It can sleep two and has a tailgate galley area that houses a 5.4 cubic foot ice refrigerator, a portable gas grille, and an 8-gallon water tank. And the most striking of all, the trailer's roof is its upside down fully functional 12-foot-long fiberglass boat, that when removed has a canvas top roof. Although missing from this package, it originally came with a 3 hp Johnson outboard motor that folded to fit into a space-saving suitcase. Because the list price for the trailer in 1952 was advertised for about the same price as Ford's first year lower cost all steel boded ranch wagon, only 15 were built. This one spent most of its life stored indoors, so it's in mint condition sporting the same Meadowbrook Green and Sungate Ivory paint as the wagon. ### **JULY 11 CRUISE WINNER 1928 MAXIM FIRE ENGINE**

The Maxim Motor Company in Middleborough, MA specialized in manufacturing fire fighting equipment from its founding in 1914 by its then fire chief, Carlton Maxim, who thought he could build a better fire engine than the town had recently purchased. Since that beginning, Maxim produced over 3,000 fire engines up until it ended operations in 1989. A side note, in 2009 Maxim was re-established as a brand of custom fire apparatus by North Attleborough's Greenwood Emergency Vehicles.

The nearby town of Stoughton, MA purchased a new 1928 Maxim pumper fire engine and put it into service up until 1956. During the 2020 pandemic recovery, Joe Mokrisky, President of the Stoughton Historical Society, was able to secure a grant to have Gaspar's Automotive Restoration in Manchester, CT, restore their Engine #2 over a two-year period and, having just gotten it back two months ago, Joe was able to bring it to our July 11 cruise to show it with the Rhode Island Antique Fire Apparatus Society display

that Richard Quetta organizes every year.





Here's something good following the 2020 Pandemic, this I 928 Maxim Pumper restoration project thanks to the Stoughton Historical Society obtaining a Massachusetts Capital Preservation Funding grant along with Town meeting approval in 2021 and completed by Gaspar's Automotive Restoration in Connecticut followed by town unveiling in June 2024.

## **NEW BEDFORD 50'S NIGHT**

Every 3rd Thursday in July, the tradition of hosting a 1950's era cruise-in car show event in downtown New Bedford harkening back to those days when teens used to drive back and forth though their hometown streets on the big shopping night blasting out their favorite AM radio station's latest Rock & Roll tunes. Those shopping nights downtown suffered when shopping malls arrived in the 1970's. In 1990, a downtown merchant named Joe Jesus recruited other fellow business owners and the city to host an annual nostalgic cruise-in with D.J.'s and live bands. Joe died in 2019 and, with the 2020 pandemic, so did its annual 50's night, that is, until 2022 when the widow of a regular 50's night participant of the cruise, that would attract hundreds of classic cars and hot rods and thousands of spectators, stepped up and offered to fund it's revival. To be sure this event will continue into the future, several of the local car clubs are collecting a \$10 donation from the show car participants, a nominal amount when there are at least 3 D.J.'s and five live bands entertaining everyone from 6 to 9 PM. This year the cruise was expanded down the entire length of Union Street, from 6th Street to Rte. 18, experiencing the largest turnouts due to perfect weather according to Bob Bramwell, President of the Cuz's Car Club. The Mass Cruisers also enjoyed reserved parking along Union Steet at Wings Court.

The Wentworth Institute SAE Leopard Racing Club members conduct an annual car show at their Huntington Avenue Campus each July. Although the show isn't heavily promoted, a few of our club members, some former alumni like myself, like to attend each year to show support for the club's Baja Race Car build project. Also, Herb Connors, the Wentworth Engineering School Lab Director, likes to bring some of the SAE club members to our Bass Pro Shops spring cruise. Although there were only two of us attending this year's show, John Ricker with his Mount Washington "Climb to the Clouds" racing 1986 Porsche 944 Turbo and me with my 12 year old great grandson Brad in the '91 Mustang 7-Up edition convertible, both cars came away with trophies for Best Race Car and Best Ford.

The Society of Automotive Engineers (SAE) Baja club at Wentworth is about eight years old with over 30 active members ranging from freshmen to seniors and from mechanical engineering to construction management majors. Their members have a passion for cars, trucks, motorcycles, and the challenge of designing and building a prototype of an all-weather, rugged, single-seat, off-road recreational vehicle intended for sale to the nonprofessional weekend off-road enthusiast. They compete nationally with as many as 60 to 100 other college clubs.

The annual car show allows the SAE Leopard Racing Club to showcase their current SAE Baja Race Car design that will be competing in the September 2024 SAE Baja competition in Michigan. Baja SAE Williamsport They are also looking forward to a

newly created Formula Electric team, which is planning on being competition ready for the 2025 season. We'll look forward to seeing them again next July.

From a 3-D model chassis design to complete build, Wentworth SAE Leopard Racing Club members spend a couple of hours, two late afternoons each week, during the year getting their single seat off-road four-wheel drive ready to compete annually each year against 60-100 other college SAE Racing Clubs.

### SEMA ACTION NETWORK

The SEMA Action Network (SAN) was formed in 1997 to unite vehicle clubs and enthusiasts with members of the specialty auto parts industry as a political voice for the hobby. As the Massachusetts 193<sup>rd</sup> General Court ended its 2023—2024 formal session in July without any legislative action seen on bills beneficial nor on bills that could prove harmful to our hobby, it is also a good time to check the pulse of legislative activity across the country using the SEMA Action Network website <a href="Home | SEMA ACTION NET-WORK (semasan.com">Home | SEMA ACTION NET-WORK (semasan.com</a>) to learn what actions affecting the hobby in other states could possibly work their way into our own state's legislative process when the 194<sup>th</sup> General Court convenes in January 2025. California usually provides the model by which other states will soon follow.

- A warning shot across our bow occurred on October 9, 1993 when, as part of their strategies to achieve 100% zero emissions by 2035, California Gov. Gavin Newsom signed a law, AB1346, that will effectively ban the sale of gas-powered small off-road engines spark-ignited engines rated at or below 25 hp. The bill directs the California Air Resources Board (CARB) to ban the sale of new small off-road engines used in equipment which includes generators, lawn equipment, and other small off-road engine equipment.
- Seventeen states have adopted California's emissions standards over the past 20 plus years and nine states have recently passed laws and/or resolutions rejecting government deciding what technology American consumers must purchase. Virginia is the first state to untangle itself from California's emissions standards and EV mandates while Connecticut, Maine, New Jersey, Ohio, Louisiana, Georgia, Kentucky & Kansas were also submitting legislation to prevent the California 2035 100% zero emissions strategy from being adopted or allowing vehicle choice by states and not by government mandate.
- California legalized "cruising" in 2023 and other states which had previously followed California's lead that allowed communities to ban or restrict "cruising", lwere also attempting to undo the ban.
- Maine was attempting to increase from 25 years to 35 years the definition of an antique vehicle.

So, as the EV evolution and zero emissions strategies nationally continue overshadow our collector cars as well as our daily drivers and lawn mowers, we have to carefully monitor our own state's General Court.




