

Cruisin' at the speed of fun JUNE 13 M.A.A.C. MEETING

Having had the Bass Pro Shops Conservation Room reserved for the June 13 Massachusetts Association of Auto Clubs Spring/Summer meeting being pre-empted for a Bass Pro Shops activity, M.A.A.C. President William Ellis set up a tent outdoors in the shade of the south end of Lot 16 at the Bass Pro Shops cruise. The attending M.A,A,C, Board members and club representatives brought their own event folding chairs and seemed to settle in and enjoy the beautiful weather for this much delayed Spring/Summer annual meeting which was needed to execute the formal business of electing the 2024 officers and Board of Directors. Being the final year of the 193rd General Court which formally ends July 31, 2024, all the pending legislative bills M.A.A.C. has been following were discussed to determine if there were any bills of interest that could be passed with an assist from M.A.A.C.'s lobbyist who will be contacted for his assessment. All bills of interest along with M.A.A.C.'s position noted can be seen at Bills of Interest – Massachusetts Association of Auto Clubs (massautoclubs.org)

The one bill discussed that may have the best chance of being passed before the General court formal session ends is the U.S. 1, 6 & 20 Historic Route designation which has no opposition but has been in the Bills in Third reading awaiting to be sent to the House floor for a vote. The new Chairman for the Bills in Third Reading was contacted to see if M.A.A.C. can meet and discuss this bill as well as others of interest.

Another newly identified issue with registering 25 year and older vehicles was generating a lot of chatter at the M.A.A.C. meeting was also discussed. Reports that the MA RMV has been quietly refusing to register the growing number of 1990 era KEI Japanese trucks and vans, also known as *kei-jidōsha* class of light vehicles, that are becoming very popular with auto hobbyists. This is not just a Massachusetts-only-happening as reports that neighboring Rhode Island has been contacting previous owners of legally imported and subsequently registered KEI trucks to have had their registrations revoked and were asking owners to return their plates. There is a lot of confusing information about what is really happening in Massachusetts and what the reasons for denying registrations are. We will keep you posted on the M.A.A.C. website as more vetted information is available.

import mini Japanese KEI trucks and vans, like the one shown above next to a Ford pickup, have statutory size and engine displacement limits (1.6L) in two and four wheel drive configurations that, because of their vehicle length restrictions are usually built as "cab overs" to maximize load carrying capability with 6 ft. beds. As the price of American brand trucks keeps rising along with their used counterparts, these 25 year and older minis have been imported into the U.S. with very few restrictions resulting in some states prohibiting their use on interstate highways while others are beginning to refuse registering them.





June 13 & 27 Bass Pro Shops Cruises

WOW! We were finally able to host two consecutive Bass Pro Shops cruises without weather or Gillette event conflicts and the participation by the collector car community was awesome. At the cruise entrance, you'll see a new Food Pantry sign with a thermometer displaying your \$\$\$ donations progress toward an ambitious 2024 goal to exceed the 2023 \$31,000 collected. We have been running into challenges each cruise having to dispose of 30 -40% of the non-perishable food donations

that are at or past their expiration dates, in damaged packaging or simply a non desirable food for normal American diets. We encourage cash donations, 100% going to the five local area food pantries, that allow stocking their shelves with needed perishable and non-perishable food and sundries from the Boston Area Food Bank distribution center at an advantageous \$1 purchasing of \$20 equivalent items.

June 13 Cruise Winner: 1949 Ford FI

Jon Vanloon bought his 1949 Ford F1 pickup 30 years ago from a friend who originally planned to salvage the bed for his own project 1950 Ford F1 but had let the '49 linger in the background. Jon began the long process of restoring and building it in his one car garage with his friends and cousins, one being Billy who is a body man and is pictured here ridding shotgun in the pickup to attend his first Bass Pro cruise.

Jon drove the F1 around for 15 years in primer which was an old school practice back in the day before having his cousin finally paint it with its current striking Audi Papaya Orange color just two months ago. The truck, now 99.9% finished, is powered by a GM 468 (.060 over 454) with a 700 R4 tranny and Jag XJ6 rear end fitted with 3.73 Auburn gear set and inboard rear disc brakes. She rides on a '73 Camaro front clip with 15-6-inch Radir Tri-Ribb front and 15-8 rear wheels shod with Firestone wide white radials. The white oak bed is sealed with many coats of Min-wax Helmsman Urethane, and with a careful eye, you'll be able to notice details like hidden smoothed fender mount bolts, gas filler located in the truck bed, frenched recessed taillights, and its subtly louvered hood that make this truck tonight's worthy Vintage Motorsports selection

One of the two June 13 Vintage Motorsports selections is Greg Asselin's 1955 Chevrolet Nomad Station Wagon. Originally from California, it was being rebuilt as a Pro Touring Resto Rod by a Denton Texas doctor for the June 2004 Hot Rod Power Tour from Arlington, Texas to Green Bay, Wisconsin. After completing the Power Tour, Greg negotiated with the good doctor and brought this beauty up to New England where he has since added his own touches to the Ford Grey & Silver painted Nomad that is sporting custom grey leather upholstered Mazda seating interior. He's upgraded the power plant with a 350 Ram Jet PFI / 700 R4 tranny & 3.50 Jaguar Xj6 rear end and added Jim Meyer independent front suspension to provide disc brakes for the 15-6 & 15-8 wheels and tires. Additionally, Greg was able to display the Nomad outside the GM Detroit Headquarters for their 50th Anniversary celebration of the iconic 1955 Chevrolet in 2005. Not one to be showing up regularly at area car show to collect trophies, it was pure luck tonight's judging team of Mark and Cathy Magno were able to spot the Nomad and present Greg with a Vintage Motorsports award plaque for his gorgeous 1955 Chevy Nomad, the first year for these iconic sporty station wagons.

June 27 Cruise Winner: 1969 AMC AMX SS

Ed Invaldi's 1969 AMX SS, selected to receive the June 27 Vintage Motorsports Cruise Award, has owned it since 1976. He originally restored it to factory spec in the mid-1980's and kept it like that until the late 1990's then put it in storage during his family raising years until pulling it out for a father-son RestoRod project with his oldest son Luke in 2008. Unfortunately, Luke passed away as the project got underway, but Ed continued the project as a tribute in his honor. The original AMX muscle era 390 V8 was shipped out to expert AMC race engine builder Barry Allen in Glen Daniel, WV to turn it into a 407cu. in. 650 HP proven high performance winner and then coupled it with a Tremec-600 5 speed tranny and narrowed Ford 9-inch rear with 3.73 gears. The transformation of the original suspension, stock wheels, and fiberglass hood was all handled by Halls Custom in Hanover, MA using Control Freaks independent front suspension, 4 link rear suspension and adjustable coil over shocks, resulting in dropping the curb weight to under 2,900 lbs. The paint, also un-AMC and perfectly applied, is 2020 Porsche Aventurine Green Metallic which gives off a changing silvery grey to green light-reflecting finish as you walk around the car. 1969 was the apex year for muscle cars coming out of Detroit. We'd hear about all the Plymouth, Dodge, Chevy, Pontiac, Buick; Olds, Ford & Mercury muscle models while AMC had the SC/Rambler & AMX SS shown here that Don brought up-to-date with 21st Century upgrades.


