




# Cruisin' at the speed of fun Board Musings By Mass Cruisers Board Member Rick White

Two of the schools are similar, in that by the senior year, students at Blue Hills and Southeastern Regional generally have plotted their direction into the automotive workforce. The visit to Norfolk Agricultural School was significantly different. Some of the students gravitate towards one direction like diesel or general small engine repair, but the school's approach is to provide well-rounded training in less specialized skill areas like carpentry, resulting in a general knowledge of all trades so they can be an asset in all aspects of a typical working farm or related agricultural endeavors. I came away with a better perspective of how we can help these kids have a better chance for success. I will be bringing to the Board of Directors & our club members suggestions as to how we can best help them in the future. # Cruisin' at the speed of fun May I Cruise Winner 1956 Chrysler New Yorker



Scott Morell Jr. and his dad at their Milford Auto Sales business in Hopedale, always on the hunt for high quality classics they can sell, found this stunning Tri-tone Geranium Red, Cloud White & Raven Black 1956 Chrysler New Yorker Newport 2-Door Hardtop at the 2024 National AACA Fall Hershey Meet. It was part of the William Boucher Chrysler Collection that was auctioned last year. It underwent a nut & bolt restoration in 2017 which also included upgrading its 254 ci 280 hp HemiV8 engine to Chrysler 300 specs pushing the hp up to 340 ponies. It has the iconic era dash-mounted pushbutton "PowerFlite" automatic transmission. The factory options on this 1 of 4115 produced in 1956 include Power Steering, Power Brakes, Power Seat, AM radio w/ foot control, full gauge package, Clock & Courtesy Lighting. The soft-as-a -glove white leather over coral sculpted brocatelle cloth interior, door panels, carpet & headliner color compliment the exterior paint, unlike much of our modern vehicle interiors do today. The under-hood engine, components and finish are beautifully detailed, and the body panels are strait as an arrow with all plated chrome parts, bumpers and trim have been spectacularly restored and finished. The trunk is beautifully detailed with the correct spare tire and Jack which is usually missing. The undercarriage has been powder-coated black, and all suspension components and hardware were refurbished during the restoration. If I were looking for an Iconic example of a 1950's classic to own, this HEMI powered road beauty Continued on Page 5 would top my wish list, and it is FOR SALE.

Early morning drizzle didn't dampen the spirits of the 20 or so registered Hillclimb race car and motorcycle participants, over 300 show car owners, craft vendors or the spectators at this year's 2025 Wilbraham Hillclimb. Always a treat for me to take a long distance morning cruise out to the Palmer area from my Attleboro home to watch the owners of these old timer race cars and classics being challenged by the mile long 23 percent grade hill on Monson Road in Wilbraham. Historically, the Hillclimb originally was used as the unofficial proving ground for early Massachusetts auto manufacturers to test their vehicles against one another by seeing who could make it to the top in the fastest time. And like those early automotive pioneers, the urge to race to the hilltop to record their fastest time is still alive thanks to the efforts of Stonewall Insurance owner Jeff DeMarey and founder of the Hillclimb sponsor, Springfield to Boston Education Foundation, whose mission is to educate students and young adults about antique transportation. The use of onsite OR Code posters throughout the event footprint from the Wilbraham Monson Academy show registration area and along the half mile stretch of Main Street to the base of Monson Road where the start of the Hillclimb takes place makes it easy for everyone to check the Hillclimb race participants recorded climb times throughout the morning and early afternoon while enjoying the other ongoing activities like looking over all the show cars and perusing the craft vendors and partaking of the food truck offerings. ## Cruisin' at the speed of fun M.A.A.C.Annual Meeting set for June 11 by John Buchanan



June 11, 6:30 PM at the historic Congregational Parish (Unitarian) Church in Norton Center (2 West Main Street) is the date set for the 2025 Annual Massachusetts Association of Auto Clubs annual meeting. We'd like to see more club representatives and interested individual hobbyists attend this meeting as we review and monitor the status of legislation that the bi-annual 194th General Court posted and is in process of holding public hearings. As in past years, we have identified legislation that, when passed, could impact our hobby interests. The list is posted on the M.A.A.C. website Bills of Interest - Massachusetts Association of Auto Clubs There are four troubling bills we've identified which we oppose and may need to testify against once the public hearings dates are posted.

William Ellis, who has served as President of M.A.A.C. for the past 12 years (2013–2025), is unable to continue in that capacity so there is a search for his replacement. William's expertise in digital systems software at IBM brought a high level of information gathering on critical legislation and Registry of Motor Vehicle data through the Freedom of Information Act that allowed M.A.A.C. to become better informed and prepared when filing testimony for or against legislation at the State House public hearings. This also allowed M.A.A.C. to rally support from our car club members in advance when testifying at public hearings. William said that he will continue to provide his expertise and assistance but no longer has the time to effectively lead M.A.A.C. There is also a M.A.A.C. Board of Director's vacancy that we'd also like to fill, so if you are interested in becoming an active part of this important group of automotive enthusiasts, let one of our officers or board members know.

To tease you a bit, check out Senate Bill **S.1716**. We **OPPOSE** another attempt to regulate the after market exhaust systems in our cars by declaring them illegal if they exceed 75dB. Note that highway tire noise can typically range above 75dB. Also we are seeing increased interest in understanding what im-

pact S.2246 might have as it attempts to regulate the amount of highway usage miles in meeting mandated emissions goals, so this bill was recently added to our WATCH list. So come on down to Norton town to June 11 MAAC meeting.




