




#### **SEPTEMBER 4 CRUISE WINNER 1955 Custom Chevrolet 210**

When Mike Camara, owner of the September 4 Vintage Motorsports cruise winning 1955 custom Chevrolet 2 door post 210, was building his family disposal and recycling business in the New Bedford area during the start of the muscle car era, he had no time to pursue his love for American muscle cars, although he did own a 1969 Mustang in High School that would end up being totaled. However, having sold the business in 2022 and now enjoying retirement, he's slowly been feeding that passion by collecting and building some of those iconic muscle cars that GM, Ford and Chrysler had offered back in the day. A few, like this 1955 Chevy, pre-date the 1960's but his passion to own a perfect 1955 Chevy Nomad wagon had led him to buy this nicely customized 210 2-door post Chevy in 2023 as most available Nomads he'd come across were not very nice. This '55 is powered by a GM ZZ502 V8 with a Tremec 5-speed tranny and 3.91:1 Ford 9" Rear. The front independent suspension is riding on 245/45Z917 tires and the rear 4-link suspension sporting 335/30ZR18 tires are riding on Billet Specialties wheels with Wilwood Disc brakes all around. The outstanding bronze and platinum metallic paint is complimented by matching leather upholstered cabin. And, if this Chevy is a winner, I learned Mike recently found that missing perfect 1955 Chevy Nomad and added it to his growing collection of 29 cars. I can't wait to see that beauty.

Our September 18 Vintage Motorsports cruise winner's story begins 40 years ago when Frank Bianco and his High School buddies would spend their Saturday mornings helping him build a 1929 Ford hot rod which he drove 10 years before selling it after getting married and starting a family. Fast forward to 2025 when Frank's beloved companion Vizsla hunting dog of 13 years, LOLA, died leaving Frank without his riding companion. Having the means now to buy his dream ride, a deuce coupe, rather than build one, and with his wife Sadie's approval, his search resulted in finding exactly what he wanted to honor LOLA when going cruising at the Motor City muscle car dealer Vanguard Motor Sales. Frank's 1932 Ford 5W Coupe in Viper Blue & Wimbledon White is powered by a small block chevy 350 w. TH 350 tranny & Ford 9 in, 3.00:1 Tru Trac rear end riding on a So Cal Chassis w. Heidt's IFS front suspension with ladderback rear w. coil-overs & big P225/75/R15's in the rear & little 165R 15's up front to give it a proper street rod stance. The custom RodDoors complimentary Crème & Blue leather interior carries the traditional era rolled & pleated theme inside the cabin and trunk. Inside the cabin Auto Meter Classic gages are set in the machine turned dash & Vintage Air A/C controls along with Flaming River tilt steering column with floor shifter and that blue flaked steering wheel make this a comfortable road touring rider. 
#### 2025 Adirondack Nationals at Lake George

The 2025 Adirondack Nationals appeared to be bigger than the past years. I would say there were upwards of 1.500 cars total for both show fields with most likely another several hundred non registered cars driving up and down the streets throughout the week. We can attest that there were more flea market vendors at the show this year as our usual parking spaces in one corner of the lower field, where we have set up shop for the past several years was filled with a flea market vendor. The "ring" around the perimeter of this field which was mostly left empty or used for car parking also had vendors in these areas. The weather for the most part cooperated as the only rain we experienced was Saturday morning starting around 9 am and ending by 3:30 in the afternoon which gave it time for the roads to dry out and not have to cancel the Saturday night parade which, as always, is a blast to watch. As tradition has it, the Adirondack Nationals came to an end at 10 pm with a fabulous fireworks display over the lake which we can watch from the lakeside hotel property where our club members stay.





What makes the Adirondack Nationals at Lake George unique and so popular is not the car show but the daytime cruising up and down Canada Street morning, afternoon and especially at night when the street from 5-8 PM on Friday and Saturday is closed to all traffic except to the 1,500 registered show cars displaying their show entry stickers.
