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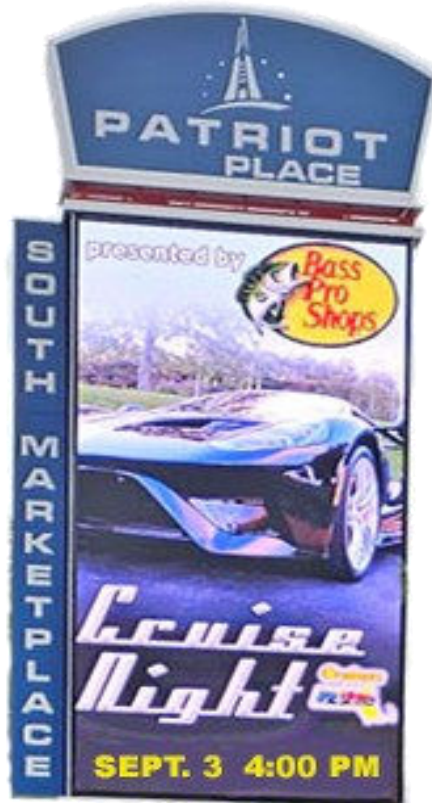
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Board Musings

<https://massautoclubs.org/> If you’ve been wondering what is happening to all the bills MAAC has been following on Beacon Hill during the final months of the 194th General Court you’ll have to come to the Fall Quarterly MAAC meeting in October. My notes from the Wednesday April 22nd Spring meeting was planned for Wednesday Oct. 21. The location had not been determined when I last talked with MAAC President William Ellis at our August 20 cruise but, based on the increased attendance and interest at the Spring meeting held in at Mike Camara’s private American Muscle Car Collection in Lakeville, he was actively looking to secure a similar car collection location that MAAC meeting attendees will be able to enjoy attending. One topic that’s been heavy in recent news that he expects discussion about is recent police abuse of the Flock Safety automated license plate reader systems. With at least 80 Massachusetts police departments using them across the state, some communities including Hopkinton, Auburn, Douglas & Southbridge are either deactivating or removing their Flock cameras. Although Flock’s CEO claims their AI technology can eradicate crime in America, a pretty tall order by anyone’s measure, they aren’t the only game in town. Motorola Solutions Vigilant system boasts a network of over 1,800 government agencies and claim they have over “**35 BILLION**” historic and recent driver location records in its national database. The technology allows law enforcement agencies to track motorists’ vehicles in real time without a warrant, probable cause or reasonable suspicion of wrongdoing with nationwide data sharing. George Orwell’s 1984 dystopian novel about mass surveillance can finally be achieved easily in 2026 with all the latest drone and camera technology using enhanced Artificial Intelligence and mass data storage.

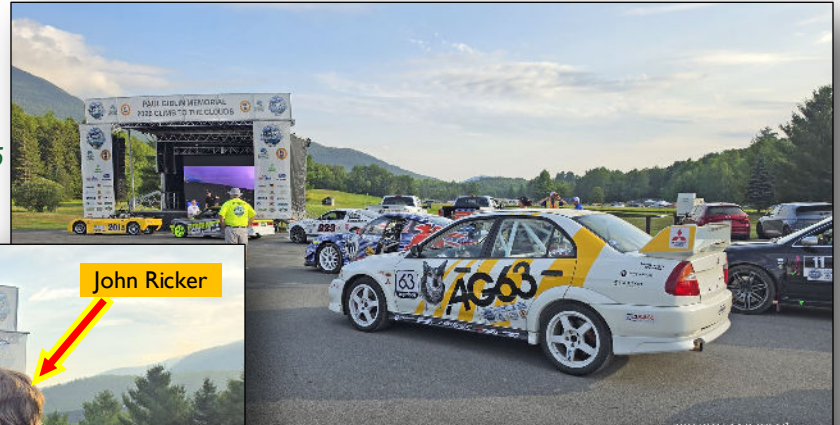
It's been five years since the last Mt. Washington Hill Climb was held by the Sports Car Club of New Hampshire. This year's event honored Paul Gibling who died in 2022 and was recognized as the heart and soul of this historic race from the 1990's when it became a consistent event that attracted drivers intent on challenging the tallest mountain on the east coast. This year's "Climb" also coincided with the 120th Anniversary of the family owned and operated 7.6 mile long Mt. Washington Auto Road that every New Englander tried at least once and proudly displaying an iconic 'This Car Climbed Mt. Washington' bumper sticker on their family car.

Friday and Saturday mornings are when the 80 participating climb car drivers get to test the roads challenging turns ahead of the Sunday's official "CLIMB TO THE CLOUDS" timing runs. Most of our club members that attend the entire weekend to cheer on fellow club member John Ricker for his second attempt climbing the "Rockpile" also volunteer to help the host SCCNH club with members with parking and ticketing.

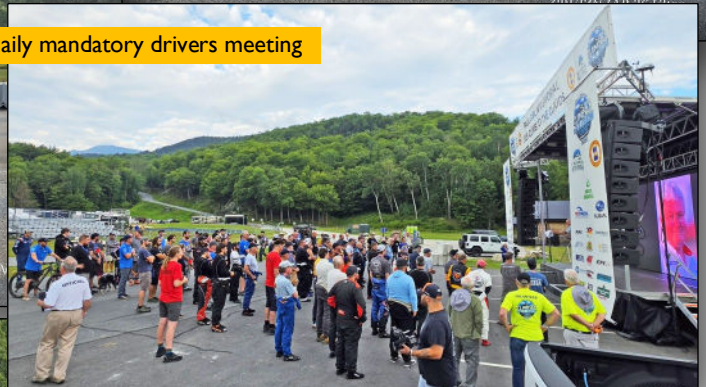

Club member John Ricker built a new 1986 Porsche 944 Turbo replacing the one that experienced transmission problems when he attempted to complete the 2021 Hillclimb, his first time racing the "Rockpile". John competes in the High Performance Showroom Stock (HPSS) class which only had one other competitor listed in the line-up, a 2002 Mini Cooper S driven by an experienced hill climb driver who's competed in every Climb to the Clouds since 1990. This year's program consisted of two days, Friday—Top half of the Mountain test runs and Saturday—Bottom half of the mountain test runs before Sunday's official "Climb to the Clouds" timed runs in the morning and afternoon with the combined runs determining the class winners.

Sunday was race day and at 5:30 AM Scott Nedley & Diane Thorton drove to the top of the 7.6 mile Mt. Washington Rd. to photograph the finish line action while I took one of the media vans to the sharp hair-pin Cragway Turn above the tree line at 5,000 ft. to catch the action there. The heavy morning cloud cover above the tree line limited the 9:30 AM 1st timed run to just the lower half of the mountain and the scheduled 1:30 PM 2nd timed run was delayed an hour for the cloud conditions at the summit to abate.

John also had some tough competition against a Mini Cooper SS but was able to post a respectable sub 9 minute time of 8:17.507 min.

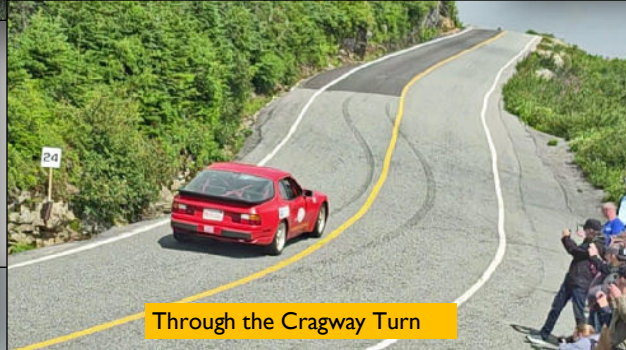

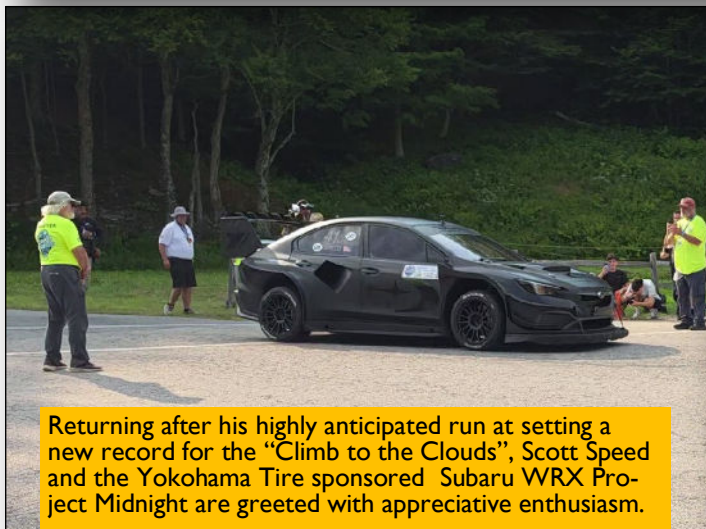

With the 7.6 mile Mt. Washington Road now fully paved without any gravel section, everyone was anticipating the 5:28:67 min. course record set by Travis Pastrana in 2021 to be broken at this year's "Climb to the Cloud" Hillclimb. There were potentially four under 6 min. Unlimited Class drivers challenging the record. Although our club's primary focus was on fellow club member John Ricker and his CLIMB efforts, Scott Speed in the Yokohama sponsored purpose built Subaru WRX Project Midnight was everyone's favorite to set a new course record. With heavy overnight rain Saturday evening, weather conditions Sunday was of most concern. The morning run was limited to the lower mountain half due to a heavy morning cloud ceiling reducing road visibility above the timberline. Course Marshalls were hopeful the cloud cover would clear so the afternoon run would be the full course. After delaying the 1:30 PM afternoon for an hour, the top half of the mountain did clear enough to safely run the full course. And Scott did blow past the record by over 15 seconds with an afternoon full course run of 5:11:89 minutes at an average speed of 87.72 mph. I decided to come down from my rocky perch at the Cragway Turn above the lower half course finish area following the morning run while club members Diane Thornton & Scott Nedley endured the full day at the top which was experiencing heavy cloud cover and 58 degree windy conditions all morning into the afternoon. Regardless of the discomfort, this is still more fun than sitting all day at a car show.

Tonight's August 20 Bass Pro Shops Vintage Motorsports Cruise Award selection was made by the WCVB Channel 5 Chronicle Producer Ramen Cromwell and his video team that was attending our cruise filming cars and interviewing their owners for a future program episode. They selected William Ellis's New Jersey barn-find rare 1938 Cadillac Series 75 Fleetwood Convertible Sedan (1 of 58) that was in its family's possession for 86 years and was kept in storage since 1999. Still in drivable condition, it was driven to Hartford, CT from New Jersey where its current caretaker William Ellis, who hails from Wellesley, picked it up this Thursday in Hartford to drive it back home but then stopping into our Bass Pro Shops Cruise on his way home to show his fellow car buddies who were at the cruise to see. Coincidentally, the Chronicle production team came by and was able to interview what its like for a barn-find car enthusiast to show their latest find. William's '38 has the 346 cu. in. V-8 with its first year on-the-column 3-speed manual shifter. With only 24,000 miles on the odometer, William's plan is to preserve and continue to drive it as original, except for fixing the brakes which he discovered needs some work to safely stop this 5,000 Lb. survivor safely when driving in traffic on today's roads. What a wonderful experience to share with us. Thank you William.

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The WCVB Channel 5 Boston Chronicle crew was filming cars at our August 20 Bass Pro Shops cruise and interviewing their owners. They ultimately selected William Ellis's barn find 1938 Cadillac Fleetwood Convertible Sedan to receive the Vintage Motorsports cruiser of the night award after having driven it, not trailering it from its former New Jersey home for 86 years to its new home in Massachusetts.

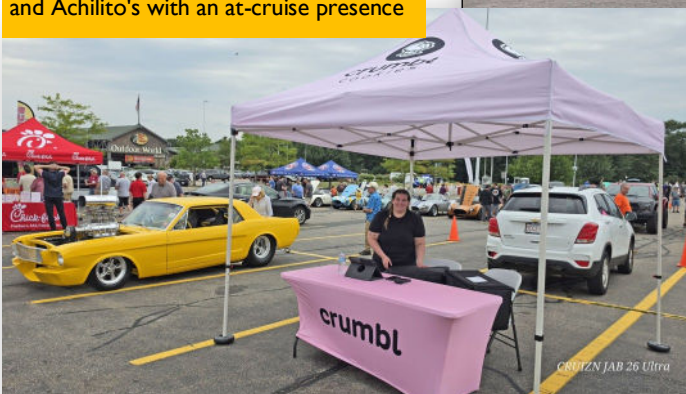

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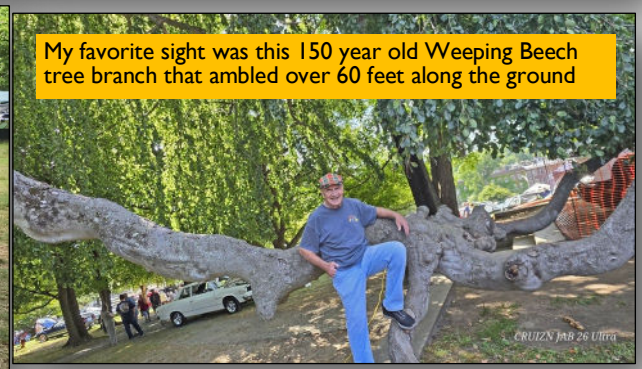


Whitinsville's "Cars in the Park" Car Show
